academic paper from the year 2017 in the subject medicine neurology psychiatry addiction grade 2 egerton university language english abstract it appears that the field of psychology is becoming extremely fascinating day by day owing to the sophistication of newly designed psychology approaches and research advancement it is evidently true that the discipline of

psychology has undergone transient evolution since its inception and further developments are inevitable because psychological research is currently widening to incorporate different perspective which were not studied in psychology in the past initially psychology emerged as one of the classical disciplines of science but it has advanced significantly especially after psychologists established the new branch of applied psychology whose application is gaining popularity currently psychology does not only entail the social aspect of the human mind but it also involves biological perspective and this has led to the emergence of biopsychology and cognitive psychology however it is worth noting that there are different approaches of psychology but behaviourist approach seems to explain the interaction of the human mind and the environment therefore this essay will provide a comprehensive description of the behavioural approach and evaluate its strengths and limitations

the most useful therapy is one that can be applied to a wide range of client problems is easy to learn and produces lasting results following a brief intervention the cognitive behavioural approaches described in this volume probably come nearest to this ideal originally published in 1989 this book begins with a description of the cognitive behavioural revolution that had taken place in the decade prior to publication and provides therapists with the specifics of helping in four major areas child behaviour problems emotional disorders depression and anxiety interpersonal problems and addictive disorders coverage of the major areas of concern begins in each case with an overview of theory and research in the specific domain followed by detailed guidance for practice the volume represents a synthesis of the author s research and practice with patients in inner city liverpool and with employees referred by major employers the strategies described have been devised to take account of a wide variety of client social contexts and service delivery settings and the strengths pitfalls and practicalities of group cognitive behavioural approaches are also discussed the reader is finally led into largely uncharted waters the application of cognitive behavioural approaches to schizophrenia people with learning difficulties and the elderly back in print this title will still be of interest to students and practitioners in social work clinical psychology and community psychiatry

background although 50 of those who suffer a whiplash injury still report neck pain after one year there is a lack of knowledge about effective treatment for chronic whiplash associated disorders wad exercise is potentially useful but the response to exercise in chronic wad is highly variable between individuals and factors associated with good outcomes as well as the cost effectiveness are unknown aim the general aim of this thesis was to evaluate the effect on self reported disability functioning pain and selfefficacy of three different exercise interventions in chronic wad grade 2 and 3 and to determine the cost effectiveness of these interventions material and methods a total of 216 participants with chronic wad took part in this randomized assessor blinded controlled clinical trial participants were randomized to either neck specific exercise without

nse or with a behavioural approach nseb or prescription of physical activity ppa for 12 weeks evaluations of change scores and proportion of clinically relevantly improved participants regarding disability functioning neck disability index ndi patient specific functional scale psfs pain visual analogue scale of current neck pain vas p pain bothersomeness vas b and self efficacy self efficacy scale ses were made after 3 6 12 and 24 months secondary analyses were made regarding factors associated with clinically relevant improvements in disability pain and regarding cost effectiveness results disability was more improved in the nse nseb groups ndi $p = 0.02$ than the ppa group which reported no improvement at 3 and 6 months results remaining at 12 and 24 months $p = 0.02$ functioning psfs was also more improved in the nse nseb groups than the ppa group at 3 months in the nseb compared to the ppa group at 6 months and the nse compared to the ppa groups at 12 and 24 months the proportion of participants reaching clinically relevant improvement regarding ndi and psfs was also larger in the nse nseb groups at all time points $p = 0.05$ except ndi at 3 months and psfs at 24 months there were no differences between groups in vas p vasb or ses change scores the proportion of participants with clinically relevant reduction in vas p and vas b was however higher $p = 0.02$ in the nse nseb groups compared with the ppa group at 3 and 12 months self efficacy was only improved in the nse group but without any between group differences there were no significant differences in any outcomes between the nse nseb groups the only significant factor associated with both clinically relevant improvements in disability and neck pain both at 3 and 12 months was participation in the nse group with odds up to 5.3 times higher than in the ppa group different baseline features were associated with the improvements depending on the outcome and time point examined from a societal perspective nse was the cost effective option conclusion physiotherapist led neck specific exercise resulted in better outcomes than prescription of physical activity regarding disability functioning and pain the observed benefits of adding a behavioural approach to neck specific exercise were inconclusive and nse was the cost effective option from a societal perspective factors associated with clinically relevant improvements after exercise interventions in chronic wad differed whether disability or neck pain was the outcome but also differed in the short and long term participation in the nse group was the only factor associated with both outcomes after both 3 and 12 months

this book expands upon a range of economic insights within the overall context of critical theory particularly with respect to the question of socioeconomic inequalities and presents an explanation of how critical theory provides a number of interesting perspectives for economists economic agents deliberately imprisoned in their instrumental rationality as a means to survive under competitive relationships are microscopic constituents of systemic forces which exist beyond their will despite the subjective rationality of such agents in terms of formally logical transitivity and consistency aggregate market distributional mechanisms also display non rational patterns the crucial aspect of the dynamics of this system consists of the paralysing effect of the high level of socioeconomic inequality which is driven by a permanent struggle for self preservation under competitive rules it is a reminiscence of natural uncivilised relationships that constituted the reproduction process of the whole these reified agents thus become instruments of their socially constructed powers on the one hand and objects of their existential conditionality on the other hence the dialectical approach adopted by the author aims to uncover the way in which structurally genetic market forces govern individual behaviour as well as how individual behaviour shapes these structurally genetic forces which together form the transcending principles of unequal distribution this book will be of particular interest to scholars of the political economy philosophy and the methodology of the social sciences especially those concerned with inequality issues this book includes a preface written by professor martin jay
